The Information below is from *Firewise USA: Reducing Wildfire Risks in the Home Ignition Zone* and the *Firewise USA Volunteer Hourly Worksheet*. These are some examples. More detailed information is available from Firewise USA literature.

Some Examples of landscape FUEL REDUCTION/REMOVAL

Immediate Zone 0-5 feet from exterior of home

- Removing combustible materials from under decks and crawl spaces
- Keeping gutters clean
- Removing/reducing dead vegetation, dried leaves, pine needles and ground debris
- Removing/reducing trees, shrubs and vegetation 0-5 feet from the house exterior
- Replacing combustible ground cover with non-combustible ground cover.

Intermediate Reduction 5 - 30 feet from exterior of house

- Removing/reducing trees and shrubs
- Removing dead plant and tree material
- Raking and removing pine needles, leaves, ground litter, fallen branches
- Moving firewood: storing firewood at least 30 feet away from the house
- Maintaining Lawn and native grass: keeping it watered and mowed to height of 4 inches
- Clearing vegetation from under Propane Tanks
- Removing ladder fuels (vegetation under trees). Prune trees up to 6-10 feet from the ground. For shorter trees, do not exceed ½ of the overall tree height.
- Spacing trees to have a minimum of 18 feet between crowns
- Keeping tree canopy to no closer than 10 feet to edge of structure
- Watering plants, trees and lawns to keep them from becoming dry.

Extended Zone 30-100 feet from the exterior of the house

- Storing Firewood at least 30 feet from the house
- Removing dead plant and tree material
- Removing/reducing vegetation adjacent to storage sheds or other outbuildings within this area

Some Examples of HOUSE HARDENING (include outbuildings that may have these features)

- Removing flammable items from car ports
- Removing of all flammable items from underneath decks
- Installing 1/8-inch wire mesh screening on attic vents, roof and gable-end vents, and under eave areas
- Installing 1/8-inch corrosion resistant mesh on foundation vents
- Installing ½ -inch metal mesh screening between low decks from surface to ground
- Inspecting chimney spark arrestors
- Applying weather stripping to perimeter of garage doors
- Replacing flammable roof shingles with Class A composite shingles, metal, cement tile or tiles.
- Keeping roof in good repair
- Replacing plastic gutters with metal gutters
- Removing debris next to and on skylights
- · Replacing sliding doors with double-paned tempered glass
- Adding fireproof shutters to large windows and glass doors
- Replacing flammable fencing/gates 0-5 feet from house with non-flammable materials/gates
